NOTICE OF RACE

1. Rules

- 1.1. The Series will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing 2025-2028, Class Rules and the Bristol Water byelaws.
- 1.2. Competitors will behave in accordance with the [RYA Racing Charter](#).
- 1.3. No dogs are allowed on the premises.

2. Entries

- 2.1. This event is for RS Tera sailing with Pro & Sport rigs.
- 2.2. Entries should be made in advance at <https://webcollect.org.uk/cvlsc/event/rs-tera-open-meeting-2025>
- 2.3. The entry fees per boat are as follows (prior to deadline for early entries):

Rig	CVLSC Members	Visitors
Pro	£10	£15
Sport	£10	£15

- 2.4. The deadline for early entries is 23:59 on Wednesday 4th June 2025. Late entries to be accepted on Saturday 7th June no later than 10:30 subject to decision by the Host Club and Class Associations and will be subject to an additional £5 fee.
- 2.5. Those competitors under the age of 18 years at the time of the event shall be required to complete and lodge the parental/guardian's consent form included in the entry form with the Race Committee prior to the start of racing.
- 2.6. If an entry is cancelled by a competitor:
 - a) prior to the early-entry closing date, any entry fee paid will be refunded in full, less a £5 administration charge.
 - b) after the early-entry closing date, no entry fee paid will be refunded.

3. Cancellation

- 3.1. The Organising Authority may cancel the event at its absolute discretion.
- 3.2. Should the Organising Authority cancel the event prior to the conclusion of race 1 the entry fee will be refunded.

4. Communication

- 4.1 The official notice board will be located on the window of the training room in the South-East corner of the ground floor of the CVLSC clubhouse.

5. Racing Fleets

- 5.1 There will be racing for Pro and Sport rigs. Separate starts will depend on the number of entries of each rig, at the discretion of the race committee.

6. Schedule of Races

6.1 Racing to take place on Saturday 7th June;

- a) Briefing 10:30.
- b) 1st Warning signal not before 11:25.

6.2 No warning signal will be made after 15.30.

6.3 A maximum of 4 races will be sailed.

7. Sailing Instructions

7.1 Sailing Instructions will be available at

no later than 24 hours before the first warning signal. A single hard copy will be posted in the training room on the South-East corner of the ground floor of the clubhouse on the day of the event.

8. Clothing and Equipment

8.1. RRS 40.1 shall apply at all times while afloat.

9. Support Boats

9.1. Support boats shall not be allowed.

10. Scoring System

10.1 1 Race will constitute a series.

10.2 When 4 races are sailed a boat may discard their worst score. This is a change to RRS A.2.

11. Prizes

11.1. Prizes will be awarded, depending on the number of entries, after the conclusion of the last race. But as a minimum of 1st Overall in Pro and Sport fleet.

12. Rights to use Names & Likenesses

12.1. Competitors automatically grant to the organising authority without payment the right in perpetuity to make, use and show any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or filmed television of or relating to the event.

13. Risk Statement

Sailing by its nature is an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions as can be practically provided in the circumstances;
- g) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules or information produced for the venue or event and to attend any competitors briefing held for the event.

14. Insurance

14.1 Each boat is required to hold adequate insurance and in particular to hold insurance against third party claims in the sum of at least £2,000,000.

15. Invasive Species:

15.1 CVLSC and Bristol Water are committed to the prevention of the spread of invasive species. We are following the Environment Agency and RYA guidelines – 'CHECK CLEAN DRY'

Please make sure your boat has been clean and dry for at least 2 days prior to your arrival. The entry form will require you to self - certify that this is the case. You may be required to check and wash your boat before leaving Chew.
