

# Andrew Lawman Regatta Monday 6 May 2024



As many of you know, Andrew Lawman died a little under a year ago as a result of a tragic farming accident. Andrew was just 35.

Andrew had been associated with Grafham Water Sailing Club since he was a pupil at Kimbolton School. His contribution to the club was huge and centred around the Safety Fleet. He worked as a part-time Coxswain for a number of years as well as being a safety boat driver and mark layer.

Over time he increased his knowledge and experience of RIB driving and on-water safety and became an enormous asset to the club. A skilled mechanic, when anything mechanical needed fixing, Andrew could be relied on: such as getting the tractor working or welding repairs to the jetties. He was a qualified Powerboat Instructor and Mark Layer and organised regular training for the Safety Fleet members as Safety Fleet Co-ordinator.



In recent years, Andrew took on a number of formal volunteer roles within the club: Safety Fleet Captain, Chair of Safety Committee and Rear Commodore.

We are holding this event on Monday 6 May in Andrew's memory and to celebrate his contribution to the Club. The event will consist of three back to back handicap races using the "Wednesday evening" format. The overall winner will be awarded the "Grafham Past Masters" trophy. The sailing will be followed by lunch on shore.

This is a Club event. There will be no entry fee for the Regatta, but donations to MagPas will be invited.

# Andrew Lawman Regatta Mon 6 May Notice of Race

## 1. RULES

- 1.1. The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2. Competitors should note that Grafham Water Sailing Club implements the RYA Racing Charter and they will be expected to sail in compliance with it. The Charter can be found at the front of the Racing Rules of Sailing (the yellow pages after the definitions), or on the RYA website at <a href="https://www.rya.org.uk/racingrules">https://www.rya.org.uk/racingrules</a>
- 1.3. The Great Lakes Handicap System applies
- 2. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS
  - 2.1. The sailing instructions will be available at <a href="https://webcollect.org.uk/grafham/category/club-racing">https://webcollect.org.uk/grafham/category/club-racing</a> by Monday 1 May 2023
- 3. COMMUNICATION
  - 3.1. While racing, from the first warning signal until the end of the last race of the day, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.
- 4. ELIGABILITY AND ENTRY
  - 4.1. The event is open to all boats with a Great Lakes Handicap number of 1445 (RS Tera Sport) or lower
  - 4.2. Sailors should be members or guests of Grafham Water Sailing Club
  - 4.3. Boats shall enter the event by registering online at <u>https://webcollect.org.uk/grafham</u> before the start of racing
- 5. FEES
  - 5.1. There is no entry fee. However, competitors are invited to make a donation to charity which will be Magpas: they can do this on the entry page
- 6. CREW LIMITATIONS
  - 6.1. Class rules for each boat shall apply.
- 7. ADVERTISING



- 7.1. Advertising shall comply with ISAF Regulation 20 and the relevant rules of the individual competitor's Class Association. Grafham Water Sailing Club may require the display of advertising material
- 8. QUALIFYING SERIES & FINAL SERIES (Does not apply)

### 9. SCHEDULE

- 9.1. The regatta will comprise three handicap races sailed "back to back"
- 9.2. The first warning signal will be not before 1057. The races are expected to be approx. 40 minutes duration. There will be three starts as follows:Start 1 Fast Handicap 1001 and below
  - Start 1 Fast Handicap 1001 and below
  - Start 2 Slow Two Handed Handicap 1002 and above
  - Start 3 Slow Single Handed Handicap 1002 and above
- 9.3. Following the conclusion of Racing the café will be open for lunch. The prize giving I will follow on after lunch, probably in the café.
- 10. EQUIPMENT INSPECTION (Does not apply)
- **11. CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT** 
  - 11.1. RRS 40.1 shall apply at all times when afloat.
- 12. VENUE (Does not apply)
- 13. COURSES
  - 13.1. Courses will be described in the Sailing Instructions. All boats will sail the same course
- 14. PENALTY SYSTEM
  - 14.1. RRS 44.1 is changed so that the two turn penalty is replaced by a one turn penalty.
- 15. SCORING
  - 15.1. The regatta will be a three race series. If all three races are sailed then a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score. If two or fewer races are sailed then a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores
- 16. SUPPORT PERSON VESSELS (Does not apply)
- 17. CHARTERED OR LOANED BOATS (Does not apply)
- 18. BERTHING (Does not apply)
- 19. HAUL-OUT RESTRICTIONS (Does not apply)
- 20. DIVING EUIPMENT AND PLASTIC POOLS (Does not apply)
- **21. DATA PROTECTION**

#### 22. RISK STATEMENT

RRS Rule 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone.'

Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- 22.1. They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- 22.2. They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- 22.3. They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- 22.4. Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- 22.5. The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organizer does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- 22.6. The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;
- 22.7. It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event.

### 23. INSURANCE

23.1. Grafham Water Sailing Club General Instructions state that all craft shall be covered by third-party insurance for claims up to £2 million arising in any one accident.

- 24.1. Prizes will be awarded for each fleet and overall
- 24.2. The prize giving will be held in the cafe at approximately 1445.
