

Notice of Race Entries are invited for the Guy Fawkes Pursuit Organised by Leigh and Lowton Sailing Club On Sunday 6th November 2022

1. Rules

1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing 2021-2024

2. Sailing Instructions

2.1 The Sailing Instructions will be available at least 3 days before the first scheduled race on the Leigh & Lowton Sailing Club webcollect event page. See https://webcollect.org.uk/llsc and select this event.

3. Eligibility and Entry

- 3.1 The regatta is open to all monohull dinghies under 6.4m (21 feet) LOA.
- 3.2 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall complete all registration requirements and pay all fees.

4. Fees

Entry is free for Leigh & Lowton Sailing Club members. Entry for Visitors is online only and the fees are:

5. Schedule

Registration: from 11.00. Those who have entered online do not need to register.

Briefing: 12:00

1 pursuit race is scheduled.

The scheduled time of the Warning Signal for the first race (Optimists) is 12:35.

The race is scheduled to finish at 15:30

6. Clothing and Equipment

RRS 40.1 is changed as follows: Each competitor shall wear a personal flotation device at all times whilst afloat. Wet suits and dry suits are not personal floatation devices. Flag Y will not be displayed.

7. Venue

7.1 The location of Leigh and Lowton Sailing Club is Green Lane, Off Sandy Lane, Lowton, Warrington. WA3 1BJ.

8. Scoring

8.1 This is a series consisting of 1 pursuit race.

9. Prizes

Prizes will be awarded to a minimum of the first 3 places.

10. Risk Statement

Rule 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone."

Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;
- (g) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event.

11. Insurance

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of at least £3,000,000 per incident.

12. Privacy Statement

The personal information you provide to the organizing authority will be used to facilitate your participation in the event. If you have agreed to be bound by the Racing Rules of Sailing and the other rules that govern the event (the rules), the legal basis for processing that personal information is contract. If you are not bound by the rules, the legal basis for processing that personal information is legitimate interest. Your personal information will be stored and used in accordance with the organizing authority's privacy policy. When required by the rules, personal information may be shared with the RYA, your national authority and/or World Sailing. The results of the event and the outcome of any hearing or appeal may be published.

13. Cancellation

If cancellation is required due to weather or any other unforeseen event, then where possible this will be notified via the http://llsc.org.uk/ website at least 24 hours before the start time for the event.
