Organising Authority (OA) is Northampton Sailing Club in conjunction with the Class Associations

### **NOTICE OF RACE**

The notation '[DP]' in a rule means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the Protest Committee, be less than a disqualification

#### **1. RULES**

- 1.1. This event is governed by the rules as defined in *the Racing Rules of Sailing 2025-2028*.
- 1.2. Competitors shall sail in accordance with the RYA Racing Charter.
- 1.3. [DP] Rule 40.1 applies at all times when afloat.

#### **2. SAILING INSTRUCTION**

- 2.1. The sailing instructions will be available before the event, electronically on the Northampton Sailing Club website: <https://northamptonsailingclub.org>

#### **3. COMMUNICATION**

- 3.1. The official notice board will be the notice board at Northampton Sailing Club.
- 3.2. [DP] While racing, except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.

#### **4. ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY**

- 4.1. The event is open to all boats which have a valid measurement certificate issued by the appropriate Class Association.
- 4.2. All competitors must be current members of the class association.
- 4.3. Eligible boats may enter by completing the online registration on the Northampton Sailing Club website and paying the required fees.
- 4.4. Entries are not limited.
- 4.5. [DP] A Biosecurity disclaimer must be signed before launching for each visiting boat to state that the Check, Clean, Dry programme has been observed prior to arriving at Northampton Sailing Club and will be observed afterwards.

- 4.6. All boats shall sail under their register numbers to comply with RRS 77. Under exceptional circumstances a boat may be permitted to carry sail numbers or letters in contravention of her class rules provided that written application, stating the circumstances, is made to the Race Committee prior to 1st race. If such permission is granted no further change will be permitted.

## 5. FEES and ENTRY

- 5.1. The entry fee is payable via the Northampton Sailing Club website:

Double handers £40

Single handers £30

Those wishing to compete for Single day £25

All entries to be pre paid online before midnight 25<sup>th</sup> September thereafter, a late entry fee will apply of £45.00 payable on the day of entry.

- 5.2. If the event is cancelled by the OA a full refund will be given.

- 5.3. If a competitor cancels within 7 days of the event no refund will be given.

- 8.4. Each class will be separated by 5min start intervals unless numbers are low, in which case, starts may be combined at the discretion of the Race Officer.

8.5. On the last scheduled day of racing no warning signal will be made after 14:00hrs.

## **9. EQUIPMENT INSPECTIONS**

9.1. Boats and equipment may be inspected at any time.

## **10. VENUE**

- 10.1. The venue is Northampton Sailing Club, Pitsford Reservoir, Northampton. NN6 9DG
- 10.2. The sailing area will be Pitsford Reservoir.

## **11. COURSES**

- 11.1. The course will be decided on the day of the event.
- 11.2. Full details will be in the sailing instruction.

## **12. PENALTY SYSTEM**

- 12.1. The post-race penalty and RYA arbitration of the RYA Rules Disputes Procedures will be available. The post-race penalty will be 30%.

## **13. SCORING**

- 13.1. Two races shall constitute an event
- 13.2. If 3 or fewer races have been completed a boats score shall be the total of her race scores
- 13.3. If more than 3 races have been completed a boats score shall be the total of her race scores excluding her one worst score.

## **14. SUPPORT VESSELS**

- 14.1. Support boats will not be allowed.

## **15. DATA PROTECTION**

- 15.1. Results:

As part of entering this event your results will be published in the public domain and may be given to the RYA for their Portsmouth Yardstick scheme and to the Class Association. While your results contain personal data, it is normal practice to expect that, when entering an event, your results will be published, and this is a condition of entry. It is therefore part of the contract to provide you with race entry and administration that we will publish the results, which may include such information such as sail number, sailing club, age and gender (if there are age and gender related results).

- 15.2. Photography:

By competing in this event, competitors grant to the organisers without payment the right in perpetuity to make, use and show any non-identifiable motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or filmed television of or relating to the event and consent to these being published in class, club, sponsor and other publications and / or the class, club, sponsor or other websites.

## 16. RISK STATEMENT

- 16.1. Rule 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: “The responsibility for a boat’s decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone.”  
Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk.
- 16.2. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:
- 16.2.1. They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
  - 16.2.2. They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their property whether afloat or ashore;
  - 16.2.3. They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
  - 16.2.4. Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
  - 16.2.5. The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
  - 16.2.6. The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances;
  - 16.2.7. It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any competitors briefing held for the event.
  - 16.2.8. The organising authority will not accept any liability for loss, material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

## 17. INSURANCE

- 17.1. Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £3,000,000 per incident or the equivalent.

## 18. PRIZES

- 18.1. Prizes will be awarded as in 18.2 at prize giving located on the front patio or Club House lounge asap after the final race of the final day.

### **Early Arrivals**

sailors who would like to make the event a long weekend are welcome to arrive at the Club from Friday evening (access will be available from around 5.00pm)
