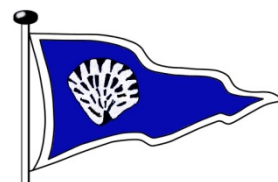




# Notice of Race



## Dart 18 SW Championships + GP4 2-3 July 2016

Organising Authority and Venue – Restronguet Sailing Club (RSC) / Windsport  
Mylor Harbour, near Falmouth, Cornwall, England

### 1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing, the prescriptions of the RYA, the Sailing Instructions, the notice of race and the International Dart Class Rules. If there is conflict between this Notice of Race and the Sailing Instructions, then the Sailing Instructions will prevail. The Regatta is designated Category C- Appendix 1- ISAF Advertising Code.

### 2 ADVERTISING

- 2.1 Advertising will be restricted to category C.

### 3 ELIGIBILITY

- 3.1 At least one member of each team shall be a current member of UKIDA and/or their own National Dart Association.  
3.2 Only the host club (RSC) members can obtain a temporary UKIDA membership for £5 if not already a full member.  
3.3 Under exceptional circumstances the race committee may permit sails carrying an identifying number other than that required by RRS 77 Appendix G, prior written approval is required.

### 4 ENTRY

- 4.1 Places will be limited to 40 entries + guests on this 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary.  
4.2 Entry fee per boat: Double-handed £48 per boat  
Single-handed £38 per boat  
**Your entry included - Boat & Car Parking Space, Saturday evening BBQ and Beach Party**  
4.3 Entries will be taken on the [RSC website](#) though Web-Collect  
4.4 Late Entries (if available) on Sat 2 July will be taken at the RSC registration office between 09:00hrs and 10.00hrs

### 5 SCHEDULE

- 5.1 There will be a briefing for competitors on Saturday 2 July at 10:00. Other meetings may be scheduled as required.  
5.2 Schedule of racing:

- 5.3 Scheduled times will be subject to amendment if conditions dictate.  
5.4 There will be no warning signal made after 14:55 on the last day of racing, except after a general recall.

## **6 MEASUREMENTS**

- 6.1 Measurement and inspection may be carried out at the discretion of, and organised by the UKIDA See item 17.1

## **7 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

- 7.1 The Sailing Instructions will be available at registration and prior to the event on the Restronguet Sailing Club website ([www.restronguetsc.org](http://www.restronguetsc.org)).

## **8 VENUE & PARKING**

- 8.1 Directions: See the RSC website: [Location](#)
- 8.2 BOAT PARKING Boats and trailers can be parked in the field directly behind the club for the duration of the event, this is the Windsport field and the cost is included in your entry. Please do not enter the boat parking area with a vehicle other than for loading and off loading.
- 8.3 CAR PARKING: As part of the same agreement 1 x car park pass is included in each entry fee, additional car parking passes can be purchased daily. Your parking pass and other off loading information will be provided on arrival, please display your parking pass clearly on your dashboard each day. Should you arrive early or depart late you will need to make your own arrangements with Windsport reception.

Follow the signs as you approach the club location. *Windsport* is directly behind RSC and has direct access into the dinghy park. So easiest to park and unload there!

For parking on Friday evening, please contact *Windsport* 01326 376191 to arrange access.

## **9 THE COURSES**

- 9.1 The courses will be detailed in the Sailing Instructions.
- 9.2 Potential sailing areas are: Carrick Roads and Falmouth Bay.

## **10 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS**

- 10.1 Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board on the clubhouse front wall.

## **11 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

- 11.1 Any change to the Sailing Instructions will be posted at least one hour before the advertised starting time of the race concerned. Any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.

## **12 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE**

- 12.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the flagpole adjacent to the slipway.
- 12.2 When flag AP is hoisted ashore, boats are requested not to leave the shore until this signal is removed. This amends race signal AP.

## **14 SCORING**

- 14.1 The Low Point Scoring System in A2 will apply.
- 14.2 The number of races to count will be one less than the number of races sailed. If only two races are sailed both will count and should only one race be sailed this will constitute a series for the event.

## **15 SAFETY**

- 15.1 Flag Y will not be flown. All competitors whilst afloat must wear adequate personal buoyancy. This amends Rule 40.
- 15.2 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible
- 15.3 The tallying system (if required) will be detailed in the Sailing Instructions.

## **16 REPLACEMENT OF CREW OR EQUIPMENT**

- 16.1 Substitution of competitors will not be allowed without prior approval of the race committee.

## **17 EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS**

- 17.1 A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the class rules and sailing instructions.

## 18 SUPPORT BOATS

- 18.1 Team leaders, coaches and other support personnel shall stay outside areas where boats are racing from the time of the preparatory signal for the first class to start until all boats have finished or the race committee signals a postponement, general recall or abandonment.

## 19 RADIO COMMUNICATION

- 19.1 A boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

## 20 PRIZES

- 20.1 Prizes will be awarded to - SW Championships 1<sup>st</sup> 2<sup>nd</sup> 3<sup>rd</sup>  
- GP 1<sup>st</sup> 2<sup>nd</sup> 3<sup>rd</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> 5<sup>th</sup>  
- Singlehanded 1<sup>st</sup>  
- RSC 1<sup>st</sup>  
- Female Helm 1<sup>st</sup>  
- Furthest Travelled  
- Youngest crew and Wooden Spoon
- 20.2 Other prizes at the discretion of the organisers
- 20.2 The presentations will take place as soon as possible after the finish of the event.

## 21 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

- 21.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

## 22 INSURANCE

- 22.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £2 million.

## 23 SOCIAL EVENTS

- 23.2 The evening of Friday 1<sup>st</sup> July will include a welcome Burger and Beer BBQ sponsored by Windsport, Followed by a very informative presentation by Ian Fraser (one of the "Dart Three") talking about the history of Dart over the past 40 years.
- 23.3 Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> July Beach Party at RSC with BBQ included in Entry fee, Extra tickets available at registration or via webcollect before the event.
